In Victoria, widespread roll-out of automated mobile phone enforcement is predicted to prevent 95 casualty crashes per year.



The scope of Tammy's role is quite fluid based on the needs of the community. Her role has enough flexibility to be able to meet the nuanced requirements of each Aboriginal patient.

The new position aligns with the priorities in Korin Korin Balit Djak and a Safer Care Victoria projected called Safer Baby Collaborative as well as with the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards guidelines for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People.

Each camera trailer has two cameras and an infra-red flash that are enabled with artificial intelligence software.

The cameras take high resolution images any time of the day or night, and in all traffic and weather conditions.

If the software at the site detects that a driver may be using a portable device or not wearing a seat belt it flags the image for further review.

For the period 1st July to 30th December 2023, the mobile phone and seatbelt detection cameras captured over 50,000 offences in our state and this included 16,000 drivers and 6,000 passengers not wearing seatbelts and detected over 30,000 drivers using mobile phones.

CONNECTIVITY BOOST DELIVERED FOR GREATER BENDIGO

The Australian Government is improving digital connectivity for the community of Fosterville, Victoria through the completion of a new mobile tower funded through Regional Connectivity Program (RCP).

The completed project is providing improved handheld mobile and data coverage to the town of Fosterville, meaning the community can better access services like health, education and government support, stay in touch with family and friends, and run successful small businesses.

The completed site forms part of a broader seven site project that will improve connectivity Axedale, Goornong, Knowsley, Colbinabbin, Toollen Sports Club and Heathcote Raceway. All seven sites are expected to be completed later this year.

The Australian Government has contributed \$1,113,050 to the total project, along with contributions from the Victorian Government, Telstra Limited and Agnico Eagle Pty Ltd.

Member for Bendigo, Lisa Chesters MP said "This significant project will make a meaningful difference to communities in Fosterville, delivering improved connectivity and access to essential digital services like telehealth.

"It will also support our local businesses to employ new technologies that will boost productivity."

This project will be delivered under Round 2 of the RCP funding, which provided \$134.2 million for 91 projects across Australia.

The Albanese Government is working to narrow the digital divide in rural and regional Australia through its \$656 million Better Connectivity Plan (BCP).

The BCP has funded additional rounds of both the Regional Connectivity Program and Mobile Black Spot Program, with funding outcomes for RCP Round 3 and MBSP Round 7 announced last year.

It is looking for 100 homes willing to donate vacuum lint and garden soil for a new study tracking how many "legacy contaminants" from Bendigo's mining past get inside.

The city was built on mining and whole neighbourhoods have risen on or near old mining operations.

It has left groups like the EPA tasked with protecting modern-day Bendigonians from potential contaminants like lead, arsenic, chromium, cadmium, copper, manganese and nickel.

Microplastics are the emerging problem for the recycling industry. Previous EPA studies have found evidence of a host of contaminants in Australian homes, its chief environmental scientist Mark Patrick Taylor said.

"We know that lead is a very common trace metal inside homes because it has been used in old paints and gasoline, for example" he said.

Scientists also know houses have a habit of accumulating contaminants over time.

Professor Taylor hopes the new study will help unearth information about mining contaminants, how widespread they are and how the EPA can

"Some of the worst damage was in the Premier's own electorate of Bendigo East, but the same issues are found right across regional Victoria. We found large potholes, very uneven surfaces, broken road shoulders and cracking on the roads. Some potholes are more than 20cm in depth, and

the feedback from residents is that on busy roads used by trucks and school buses, they need to wait for other vehicles to pass to avoid potholes. Some sections of our roads are quite dangerous." get better at managing risks.

He wanted to be clear: finding them in someone's home did not prove any health risk.

"It represents a hazard but not necessarily a risk," he said.

"A 'dangerous level', a 'safe level', they are all quite loaded questions. What I can say is that we anticipate there being a greater level of contaminants inside homes than outside."

The new study could also help scientists track the roles people might play in build ups inside homes, including how frequently they clean, whether they have carpets or other behavioural factors.

The EPA says anyone who takes part in the study will get a report on the scientific testing, an explanation of the results and advice on ways to manage potential contamination.

"You don't even have to be at home - just make sure we can access your front garden to take some samples and leave the dust in a clean plastic bag at your front door," Professor Taylor said.

Participants enjoyed the challenge of learning a new skill as well as the social opportunity to meet new people.



Grant guidelines for the Albanese Labor Government's \$200 million Play Our Way program are now available.

Federal Member for Bendigo, Lisa Chesters met with players and officials from local women's AFL team the Bendigo Thunder to discuss how opportunities like the Play Our Way fund could help improve women's participation in sport in Central Victoria. For every two males who play sport, only one female does and many girls drop out of sport and never come back later in life.

The Play Our Way fund addresses this inequity by supporting local governments, community not-for-profits and sporting organisations to make sport more welcoming and equitable for women.

Grants will be available in two streams:

Facilities: For projects that establish and improve sporting facilities that are designed for women and girls and further encourage them to take part in sport and physical activity by better meeting their needs; and Participation and equipment: For programs that encourage women and girls to participate and remain involved in sport and physical activity for life, by tackling barriers such as disadvantage or lack of equipment, and for programs that will lead to sustained cultural change in sport.

Play Our Way grant applications will be assessed through an impartial, transparent process led by the Department of Health and Aged Care.

LIFEGUARD TRAINING BOOST



Lifeguard aspirants have been going through a rigorous training schedule at the Gurri Wanyarra Wellbeing Centre in Browning Street, Kangaroo Flat.

With a majority of participants coming from regional areas of Victoria many pools across the state will benefit from gaining highly skilled personnel.

Two day training sessions have been conducted on a regular basis throughout the summer season by Roger Abel Training Services and takes in spinal management training, advanced rescue techniques, CPR training and participants also have to complete a 200 metre swim.

Roger Abel spoke with FLAT MATTERS about the shortage of lifeguards across the state and the process to bring in new personnel.

FM = How many people have you trained this summer?

FM = Where do these recruits come from?

RA= About 80% come from regional Vic

FM = Have the successful participants all found employment at pools around the state?

RA = Yes as the demand for Lifeguards is still high.

FM = As the summer season draws to a close will you continue training applicants during the winter months?

RA = Yes, just not as many as the demand drops off until approx August, all courses are number dependant.

FM = Are many of the participants in the training course from small country towns where lifeguards are critical to the pools remaining open?

RA = Yes, generally from smaller towns - in some cases the candidates don't have a license which makes it difficult to get from venue to venue.

FM = How satisfying is it for you personally to see these people put their hand up to be a lifeguard and their reaction when the course is completed?

RA = Very satisfying, I have been doing this training for over 25 years & still enjoy it immensely due to the fact the skills the candidates learn are life skills and in some cases starting there careers, & in other cases people just want to change careers. There's nothing more satisfying traveling throughout Victoria going to lots of leisure centres/ Outdoor Pools & seeing all the smiling familiar faces that I've trained over the years & in some cases two generations.
