Kangaroo Flat RSL Chaplain the Reverend Paul Bauer then led the Prayer of Remembrance and RSL Secretary Kellie Dodds gave an Anzac Day Address that demonstrated the commitment of residents of Kangaroo Flat during the war years.

Guest Speaker at the Kangaroo Flat Service was Alistair Hosking the grandson of World War 2 Veteran Bill Hosking who was in the gathering of locals and he also celebrated his 100th birthday on Anzac Day.

Then followed the laying of the Wreaths by the RSL, State Politicians and Local Government representatives.

Also laying wreaths were representatives of local community groups, local school representatives and service groups.

Then came the Last Post and Rouse led by bugler Rachael Hamilton representing the Marist Brass Band.

A Minutes Silence than gave attendees a time to reflect on the service of the Men and Women who served our country.

It was a fitting finale to a superb service conducted at the Soldier Memorial Garden in Kangaroo Flat.

#### MINING GROUNDWATER UPDATE

Work to address rising groundwater issues stemming from past mining activities around Bendigo continues.

The Department of Environment, Energy and Climate Action's (DEECA) Central Bendigo Mine Rehabilitation Project (Groundwater) – the first part of a wider reinvention of the Kangaroo Flat mine site – is taking shape, with completion anticipated within the next couple of years.

At the present moment, the project team is working through the design, and planning approval stage of the project.

A department spokesperson says, "We expect to lodge a Development Licence application with the Environment Protection Authority soon and this will ensure the project meets all required EPA permissions to deliver an effective and appropriate long-term solution for managing rising groundwater from the mines. The EPA will thoroughly review the application and, once they are satisfied it meets all environmental conditions, they will publish it on Engage Victoria so that the community can view it and

provide feedback before any major work starts."

This process can take several months; DEECA has committed to keeping FLAT MATTERS and our community up-to-date as it progresses.

There has also been a call to the industry for expressions of interest in designing, building, operating and maintaining the facility, with a strong response from suitably qualified industry members.

Potential suppliers have been shortlisted based on their proposed team, their previous experience and how they proposed to deliver the project. This shortlist will be asked to tender for the project build once the EPA has approved the development.

It is expected that tendering will commence soon and take several months, with a decision expected by the end of the year.

The project team continues to meet with individuals or community groups interested in the project. If you'd like more information or wish to arrange a session email the team at bendigo.groundwater@delwp.vic.gov.au

Crusoe College Oval adjoins the J B Osborne Theatre and changerooms to benefit local productions and sporting user groups all add up to a win – win situation for all of the community.


Already there have been many messages of encouragement from individuals and community groups and now the Kangaroo Flat Community Enterprise wants to see all this turn into a tidal wave of support.

#### **NEW LIVING ARTS SPACE EXHIBITION EMBRACES OPEN AIR INSPIRATIONS**



Lifelike is a stunning new Living Arts Space exhibition from four local artists who create observational drawings and painting in the open air, also known as en plein air.

En plein air or plein air painting is a French term that refers to the act of painting outdoors with the artist's subject in full view. It became popular amongst Impressionists during the 19th century, notably artists such as Claude Monet.

Visitor Services Manager Felicity Martin said plein air artists captured the spirit and essence of a landscape or subject by incorporating natural light, colour, and movement into their works.

"Local artists Terry Jarvis, Shaun Clarke, Meg Holmes, and Michael Watson have created the essence of life in Bendigo," Ms Martin said.

"They have all patiently observed daily life, local culture, landmarks, and landscapes to create stunning results for the Lifelike exhibition at the Living Arts Space.

"In plein air paintings and drawing, artists work directly from life around them. The artists rely much more on the direct observation of colours and let shapes flow more freely into each other and experiment with various techniques.

"The Lifelike exhibition presents beautiful depictions of life in this vibrant bustling city from different artistic perspectives."

The free exhibition presents a range of work including artworks that are still in progress, together with completed paintings and drawings so people can gain insights on the technical and creative processes used to achieve en plein air results.

The artists are also hosting Plein Air demonstrations in Rosalind Park over the coming months where residents and visitors are invited to join one of the free sessions. Booking is not required for the sessions, and all are welcome. No creative experience is necessary to take part in the hour sessions.

"This is an opportunity to see the artists at work and for residents and visitors to embrace the joy of creativity in the open air," Ms Martin said.

Participants can meet the artists at the Bendigo Visitor Centre at 9.45am on the selected session days or find the artists who will be setting up paint easels outside between the Bendigo Visitor Centre and the piazza end of Rosalind Park (near

the Bonjour Bendigo sign). Please ask at the Bendigo Visitor Centre if you are not sure of the location.

The Roulston/Gargiulo/Fuller family have caring in their blood.

Three generations have either taken up a position or plan on doing so at Bendigo Health.

It all began when Kate Fuller saw her father go through his own health battle, and she knew nursing was the career path for her.

"He got really sick while I was studying and he told me it was something I should keep going with because I was good at it. He died while I was studying and I guess that was a good insight for me to understand what (nursing) might be. It was obviously a very sad time, but going through that experience as his daughter made me realise it was something I wanted to do as a career."

Kate went from being a registered nurse in the emergency department (ED) to postgraduate studies in critical care, a clinical nurse consultant in charge of education in ED, the ED nurse unit manager (NUM) and director of nursing two and a half years ago.

Kate has two daughters, Maddi and Audrey Gargiulo, who both have plans to follow in their mum's footsteps – in their own ways.

Maddi studied allied health in her later years of high school, which was a good set up for her role as a Health Service Assistant and her current work in Bendigo Health ED.

Now a second year nursing student at La Trobe University, she always knew that was her career path too.

"I've always liked the idea of the job. There's so many different options within the job, so that pulled me towards it too."

And while there were often stories shared across the dinner table from Kate, neither Maddi nor Audrey were put off the profession.

While she only just finished high school last year, Audrey plans to loosely follow her mother into nursing, but not in the same stream.

"I work in disability services now and have always had an interest in the human connection side of nursing, but I would love to do cosmetic nursing. I think it's a very up and coming part of the industry, it's way more popular than it was 10 years ago."

The caring apples clearly don't fall far from the tree as Kate's mum Lyn Roulston volunteers at Bendigo Health.

"I have been the carer for my mum for a long time and when she was at a point where she was unable to live at home and went into care, I needed something to do."

For all four members of the family, it comes back to their connections with the organisation and others.

#### **CRUSOE UPGRADE URGED**



Our popular recreation space Crusoe Reservoir has seen many visitors over the summer months.

Locals and visitors alike see Crusoe Reservoir as a thriving recreational place to visit and it is just five minutes from the Kangaroo Flat Post Office.

But in recent times very little money has been spent on making improvements at the site and this has drawn the attention off one regular visitor.

"Felicity" told FLAT MATTERS that Crusoe Reservoir has some great potential and says it would be great to see some further development in this well used location.

"Some turf that butts into the reserve, a place where families can sit and enjoy a picnic by the water all year round.

Also needed are a couple of picnic tables where families can sit around and enjoy meals together.

Crusoe Reservoir also attracts plenty of anglers both young and old as well as canoeists and people enjoy swimming in the reservoir.

It would not be an expensive exercise for our Council to invest in this facility and put some green turf adjacent to the pontoon area, creating a great space to sit and watch the locals enjoy the water."

#### WATER IN DEMAND

Many residents on the outskirts on Kangaroo Flat have been purchasing drinking water at a great rate.

Water delivery trucks were kept busy in recent months as we went through a particularly dry spell and the Coliban Water standpipe in Station Street, Kangaroo Flat recorded some amazing figures.

A Coliban Water spokesperson told FLAT MATTERS the busiest time was during the month of February.

"More than 6.9 million litres of water was taken through the Coliban Water Kangaroo Flat standpipe on 667 occasions from January to March 2024. Interestingly, to take this amount of water at one time, the standpipe would need to run non-stop for five days.

The Kangaroo Flat standpipe was the busiest in the region during this period and this resulted in delivering one million litres more than second most popular standpipe.

February was by far the busiest month, 3.5 times busier than January and March."

#### BEWARE - DON'T DUMP RUBBISH



Residents caught dumping rubbish in bushland are facing severe fines.

In recent months there have been reports a rubbish dumping in the Kangaroo Flat region and each

has been investigated as officers check for local identification.

Residents should be aware that if any identification of the offender is located at the scene then charges will follow.

FLAT MATTERS has been in contact with the City Of Greater Bendigo and the council's Compliance Officer Ray Chalkley says there are big fines that can be made against both individuals, and companies, caught dumping rubbish in our region.

"If we can find any identification or obtain evidence of the offender then we can issue an Infringement Notice or take the matter to the Magistrates Court.

We investigated a recent dumping in Railway Street in Kangaroo Flat and we urge nearby residents to be vigilant.

If they see dumping taking place report it straight away. Even get car descriptions and number plate details. The litter offences are still found within the EPA Act but the section and way of determining the amount of the Infringement Notice has changed to section 115.

The amount of the offence depends on the volume of the litter and in this picture the case would have been more than 50 litres and the fine would have been Section 115(3) 100 Penalty Units MEANING A fine of more than \$1,900"

## NEW ACTIVATIONS, LANDSCAPING DELIVER WINTER FUN AND NEW-LOOK FOR CITY CENTRE

Hargreaves Mall will be made into a winter wonderland for the upcoming school holidays.

Stars on Ice will feature a pop-up mobile ice skating rink to be placed in the middle of the Mall and be open for business from June 28 – July 14.

This exciting installation measures 20 metres x 10 metres. The rink will be open daily, 10am – 9pm, skate sessions run for 45 minutes and start on the hour, last session at 8pm.

Ticket prices include skate hire and will cost \$24 adult (16 years and above), \$19 child/concession (6-15 years), \$15 toddler (2-5 years), \$68 family (2 adults/2 children or 1 adult/3 children), groups of 10 or more is \$18 per person and penguin pal hire (to help new skaters find their feet) is \$10.

At the same time, Rosalind Park will also host what has become a winter tradition of a light show throughout the park.

Electric Wonderland will run from June 28 – July 14, which will feature light installations that celebrate the Lunar Year of the Dragon, gastronomy, interactive pathways, laser lights, thousands and thousands of fairy lights, and a 40m replica of the Sacred Heart Cathedral.

It will be open daily, Sunday to Thursday 6pm to 9pm, and Friday and Saturday 6pm to 10pm.

Pricing for Stars on Ice and Electric Wonderland experiences will be priced individually, although organisers are working on a joint ticketing offer. More details will be shared closer to the time.

To fit the ice skating rink into the Mall, the pop up park in the centre of the Mall will be removed. This was always considered a temporary installation.

When the ice skating activation is complete, new, permanent landscaping will be installed in the centre of the Mall and bring instant greenery, shade, plants and seating.

It will feature a large synthetic grassed area and three unique shade canopy structures that also light up at night, helping to soften and cool the area.

Playful pops of colour in the form of new tables, seating and umbrellas will brighten up the Mall, together with beautiful new garden beds framed in a sustainable wood-blend product that also acts as further seating.

A stage, including disability access and umbrellas, will be incorporated into the landscaping and can host entertainers and support events in the Mall.

All components of the landscaping will be built offsite and installation is expected to take about a week and be delivered in August 2024.

# CITY APPOINTS BEAM TO OPERATE E-SCOOTER TRIAL IN URBAN BENDIGO

The City of Greater Bendigo is delighted to announce Beam Mobility has been appointed as the operator for a 12-month e-scooter hire trial in urban Bendigo, which will begin in late May 2024.

Beam is the largest shared e-scooter provider in Australia, with operations across every state and territory.

The company has more experience in regional cities than any other operator in Australia, with the service popular in other regional cities such as Albury, Launceston, Cairns, Townsville, and Broome.

Mayor Cr Andrea Metcalf said she was delighted Beam was on board for the trial, after a Public Request for Quotation process was held earlier this year.

"Beam is well-versed in operating e-scooter hire schemes and will bring their knowledge and expertise to Bendigo's 12-month trial," Cr Metcalf

"The e-scooters will provide an accessible and sustainable transport option for short trips that will allow residents and visitors to explore urban Bendigo in a new way, improve connectivity between significant precincts and destinations and stimulate new business and tourism opportunities."

Beam General Manager (ANZ) Tom Cooper said the company was thrilled to be appointed as the City of Greater Bendigo's shared micromobility partner. "Data from our other Australian operations shows a shift from cars to a preference for e-scooters for shorter trips under 5 km, and we look forward to seeing the same trend in Bendigo," Mr Cooper said.

"As we prepare to commence our operations in Bendigo, we are committed to forming partnerships with local community members and organisations and engaging in discussions around the safe operation of e-scooters to ensure the safety of riders, pedestrians, and other road users.

"We know e-scooters are new to the community, and we are committed to working closely with the local community to ensure riders know their responsibilities when on an e-scooter.

"We are confident that our experience across other Australian markets will ensure operations are a success."

Beam has developed a draft roll out plan with a tentative trial e-scooter operating area, supported by a proactive and responsive customer service approach and education for riders. The operator will undertake further consultation with the City, Councillors, businesses, and landlords over the coming weeks to confirm suitable locations for e-scooter parking and placements.

The maximum travel speed for the hire e-scooters will be 20km/h for roads and on Bendigo's established shared bike paths (they are not permitted on footpaths under Victorian e-scooter rules), and Beam will identify 'no-go' zones or some 'slow speed zones' (10km/h) where there is a concentration of activities and a high volume of pedestrians.

The City has set up a key external stakeholder group including representatives from Victorian Police, Bendigo Health, La Trobe University,

Bendigo TAFE, Bendigo Sustainability Group, Bike Bendigo, Be Bendigo and local businesses. There will be regular meetings with this group once the trial starts in late May to monitor how it is going and address any issues or concerns. Beam is expected to launch its service in late May.

E-scooter riders in Victoria must be aged 16 years and over:

- Not ride at more than 20km/h
- Ride only on shared paths and roads that have a speed limit of up to 60km/h
- Always wear a helmet
- Follow traffic rules
- Be always visible

The Victorian Government has extended the e-scooter hire program across Victoria for another six months with an early indication that permanent regulations for e-scooters will be introduced in the latter half of 2024. The state e-scooter program enables all councils to directly engage with operators to set up a trial.

In his recent annual report, Captain Peter Dole, commented that our Brigade has seen a significant increase in calls over the reporting year that ended on March 31st.

Calls within our own area have increased by 55% and the number of calls supporting other brigades doubled.

The overall call numbers went from 77 to 141.

Responding to storm events increased again this year and Captain Dole also reported on the many activities that the brigade is involved in away from emergency response.

Other recent happenings have been the Easter Fair Torchlight Parade where we were well represented by our fire fighters all dressed in the recently issued workwear uniform and accompanied by several of our junior brigade members.

A big change this year was the use of LED torches instead of the kerosene lanterns that historically go back more than a century.

Our Good Friday Appeal collection saw the brigade raising a near record of \$7,110.30. We feel privileged to be part of this vital fundraiser for the Royal Children's Hospital each year.

Our other major activity involved the State Fire Brigade Championships in Mooroopna. It was the first time since 2005 that we have competed, and we surprised ourselves! Our Seniors came in runners up in the C Division Aggregate and our Juniors who competed in the 11-13 age group achieved a good level of success finishing up there with the leaders.

Headspace has been supporting the young people of Bendigo for 12 years, providing vital access to mental health services.

Located centrally at 78-80 Pall Mall the centre has a particular focus on helping young people with anxiety, problems at school, home or with peers, depression, sexual health, physical and general mental health.

Established in 2012, headspace Bendigo

reaches an area of more than 13,000 square kilometres and has already worked with 760 young people over the last 12 months.

But the demand for support services has grown significantly over the last few years.

That's why the government has invested \$5.18 million in Demand Management and Enhancement Funding across the 6 headspace services in the Murray Primary Health Network.

This has allowed headspace Bendigo to increase staffing levels, expand their footprint and support more than 300 additional young people in Central Victoria.

Bendigo MP Lisa Chesters invited Assistant Minster McBride to meet with local young people to see first-hand the impact of the boost in funding, including reduced waiting times and improved access to services.

Headspace Bendigo is part of a network of 160 services nationally, 40 in Victoria and many in regional areas where young people have found it difficult to access support close to home.

In response to growing need and increased demand the Albanese Government is increasing the number of headspace services to 173 by 2025–26.

For young people who prefer online or phone support, eheadspace provides free, telephone and web-based services to young people aged 12 to 25 years with, or at risk of, developing mental illness.

#### REGIONAL SPORTS INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM

Following the cancellation of the Victoria 2026 Commonwealth Games, the Victorian Government committed to deliver infrastructure upgrades to a number of venues across the state that were due to host competition sporting events, and recently announced the Bendigo Sports

Package, which will provide funding for upgrades to the Bendigo Stadium, Bendigo Showgrounds and the Bendigo Bowls Club and Bendigo Croquet Club.

The City will be managing the bowls and croquet club project, which includes four refurbished bowls greens, two refurbished croquet greens and upgrades to the venue's iconic clubhouse.

The Bendigo Stadium will be expanded to include a new two-court annex and there

will be upgrades to two existing courts.

A new multipurpose pavilion will be built at the Bendigo Showgrounds. There will also be a redevelopment of the arena and upgrades to all four entrances and perimeter fencing.

Works will kick off in early 2025.
