#### **Our vision**

Our vision is to turn an outdated old theatre into a creative, multipurpose arts venue for schools, community groups and residents to enjoy. The old JB Osborne Theatre will be reborn as a place where young and old can gather for creative pursuits of all kinds in an accessible, inclusive community venue.

### **Background**

The 382 seat theatre was built in 1978 for use primarily as an education facility. It is owned by the Department of Education and administered by Crusoe College. Over the past 45 years it has been well used as a theatre space by local schools and hired by local groups for performances and gatherings.

After a black box theatre was incorporated in the new Crusoe College in 2010, the JB Osborne Theatre was considered redundant. With minimal maintenance the building fell into disrepair and has limited community use due to its shortcomings.

The building contains asbestos, so remediation works are difficult and expensive. It leaks, has rotting floors and ceilings, no heating and dangerous electrical systems, making it unsafe.

Community use dropped as groups needed to look elsewhere for suitable venues.

# Meeting our community's needs now and into the future

Thanks to decades of local and state government investment, our suburb has wonderful sports facilities, green recreation spaces, meandering walking tracks, growing retail precincts and excellent education facilities.

Gurri Wanyarra meets our needs for swimming and gym. What the Kangaroo Flat community desperately needs now is an investment in creativity.

#### Who will benefit?

The Kangaroo Flat population of approximately 12,000 people is considered to be one of the more disadvantaged communities in Victoria. Compared to Greater Bendigo it has proportionally:

- More 'Seniors' and 'Frail aged'
- Fewer 'Tertiary educated and independent' people and 'Older workers and pre-retirees'
- More migrants and non-English speakers
- More unemployed. Of those employed, labourers were the biggest group
- More 15-24 year olds disengaged with education and employment
- More one-parent families and lone person households
- More renters

The area is growing, with the biggest changes being in the following age groups:

- Seniors (70-84), empty nesters and retirees (60-69)
- Parents and homebuilders (35-49)
- Young workforce (25-34)

# How will a creative space meet our community's changing needs?

An accessible, multipurpose creative space will provide our community with the flexibility to engage our diverse and growing population segments: seniors, families and retirees. Creativity transcends barriers, appealing to all ages, abilities and education. To build Gurri Wanyarra, the old Leisure Centre needed to be demolished. Small groups and clubs lost a local "community centre". Redevelopment of the JB Osborne Theatre will return that space, to accommodate potential uses such as:

- A venue for community theatre groups
- A cinema
- Indoor sports such as dance, yoga, callisthenics or martial arts
- Art, sewing, craft or other creative classes
- U3A activities
- Seniors meetings and creative activities
- Youth programs and events
- A space for all schools to use

Local schools have expressed interest in reviving the space. Crusoe College needs more space for ten drama classes each week that cannot be accommodated in their black box theatre. Kangaroo Flat Primary School and St Monica's Primary School are both close by and could make use of more flexible spaces. Sporting groups are also keen to see new facilities added to the complex as the school oval is adjacent and there is a need for women's change rooms and toilet facilities for participants.

Kangaroo Flat's population is growing and becoming older. As people age in place, facilities are needed to keep people actively engaged in mindful activities in their local area.

Public transport may not be close by, and can be difficult to use by those with physical limitations.

With more people of limited income and inhibited mobility, an accessible, central, attractive, low cost facility will help people make the most of life in Kangaroo Flat.
